Adjustable Tables for SPMH

The tables can be adjusted to accommodate many different types of wheelchairs and other mobility-assistive devices. We believe the addition of these tables will provide our residents with additional comfort and independence in their daily lives.

Chairs for Resident Rooms

Another project brought to the attention of the Foundation was the need for chairs in our residents' rooms. During COVID, visitation rules and regulations changed and family members frequently found themselves visiting for longer periods of time with their loved ones. As a result, there was a need for seating to allow visitors to sit and relax while spending valuable time in the company of their family and friends. Given the different dimensions of many resident rooms, and again adhering to strict health and safety guidelines, a chair design was selected to meet these changing needs. The benefits of the purchase were immediately recognized and visitors were pleased to be able to rest during their visitations. Again, this initiative conveniently fell within our campaign to - Make the Home a Home.



We believe these purchases have improved living conditions for our residents and their families. In addition, these accompaniments have improved working conditions for our staff. One of our main goals is to enhance the living and working conditions at St. Patrick's Mercy Home.
